5. As of late 1982 at Yen Tu, north of Vang Danh, work was believed being conducted on a secret strategic project by the People's Army of Vietnam (PAVN) with Soviet assistance. At a PAVN center in Hoa Binh work is being performed on modifying the Soviet SA-2 to make it as effective as the SA-3. Comment: Yen Tu may be near Pha Lai, which is the location of a PAVN missile unit, but the military center at Hoa Binh is unconfirmed. Why PAVN would want to modify the SA-2, which has a longer range than the SA-3 was not explained.)
