I. THE FOLLOWING IS AN UNEVALUATED VERSION OF THE HUMINT

REPORT WHICH WAS PASSED TO U.S. ADVISORS BY AN OFFICER, CONCERNING A POW/MIA CAMP LOCATED IN SARAVAN PROVINCE, LAOS.

SUBJECT: AMERICAN POW CAMP IN SARAVAN PROVINCE (LAOS)

DATE: 21 AUG 84

1. THE SPECIAL DETACHED ELEMENT RECEIVED AN UNCONFIRMED REPORT THAT THERE IS A CAMP FOR AMERICAN PRISONERS OF WAR IN THE AREA OF THE HEUP VALLEY, BAN KADON VILLAGE, NAM HIANG SUB-DISTRICT, MYANG LAMAM DISTRICT, SARAVAN PROVINCE. A SUMMARY OF THE IMPORTANT FACTS ARE AS FOLLOWS: (BRIEF MAP IS ATTACHED)

1.1 NUMBER OF PERSONS IN CUSTODY: 23 AMERICAN PRISONERS OF WAR
1.2 LOCATION: THE CAMP IS IN THE AREA OF THE FOOT OF A MOUNTAIN, SURROUNDED BY TRENCH WITH WATER FROM THE NAM PHUANG. THE CAMP IS SURROUNDED BY THREE BARBED-WIRE FENCES. THE INNER-MOST BARBED-WIRE FENCE IS CONNECTED TO THE TWO SLEEPING QUARTERS OF THE POW'S. THE SITE IS COMPOSED OF:

1.2.1 TWO POW SLEEPING QUARTERS (INSIDE THE FENCES)

1.2.2 ONE KITCHEN BUILDING (OUTSIDE THE FENCES)

1.2.3 CAMP FOR ETHNIC KHA LAO SOLDIERS (GUARDS) COMPRISING THREE BUILDINGS.

1.3 GUARD FORCE: THERE ARE ABOUT 30 FULLY ARMED ETHNIC KHA LAO SOLDIERS AS GUARDS. FROM TIME TO TIME, 10-20 VIETNAMESE SOLDIERS COME AND INSPECT THE CAMP, ABOUT ONCE A MONTH.

1.4 COMMUNICATIONS: THERE IS A RADIO TRANSCEIVER IN CONTACT WITH THE PARAT STATION IN VIENTIANE. IT HAS AN ANTENNA ABOUT 500 FEET HIGH.

2. THE SPECIAL DETACHED ELEMENT 3-4, AFTER CONSIDERATION, IS OF THE OPINION THAT THIS INFORMATION SHOULD BE PROVIDED TO THE ANTI-SABOTAGE UNIT AND DIV SIX FOR THEIR KNOWLEDGE ALSO.

Review of KIQ/DKIQs for FY 76

References: IAF DIR-4-75-530 dated 6 Nov 1975, subject: Guidelines for Support to DC-4 Regarding DKIQ/ICR Problems

1. DIR-4H has reviewed the documents held in DIR-4 related to the referenced IAF.
2. It is confirmed that DIR-4H has a primary interest in the DKIQs pertaining to the PW/MIA situation listed on page XIV.B.-1 of DIA publication DDP-2600-209-75 dated July 1975 subject: Defense Key Intelligence Questions (DKIQ) FY 1976.
3. It is noted that CIA has failed to include a question concerning the resolution of the PW/MIA situation in its Key Intelligence Questions (KIQ), FY 1976 (CIA Publication USIB-D-22.1/43 dated October 1975). The House of Representatives recently established a 10-man select committee to investigate the PW/MIA problem. Thus the subject continues to maintain a high-degree of national interest. PW/MIA resolution questions might appropriately have been included in the CIA publication under Substantive Objective #3 Key Intelligence Questions - South and Southeast Asia (page 9) or in additional KIQs (page 16).
4. In regards to paragraph 2 above and in consideration of the extremely limited collection capability in Southeast Asia, it is considered a necessity to apprise all collectors of the PW/MIA requirements.

SUBJECT: KIQ/DKIQ Coverage (U)

1. The recent Key Intelligence Evaluation Program (KEP) clearly indicated the need for improved procedures to enhance and capture DoD Human Source Intelligence collection against these DoD and USIB priority informational deficiencies. Appropriate responsiveness by DoD Human Source Intelligence Collectors to KIQs and DKIQs has a considerable impact on the continuing welfare of HUMINT and the support it can render to appropriate production activities.

2. This office, as the manager of the DoD Human Source Intelligence Tasking System (HITS) is devising new procedures to bring forth a coordinated tasking methodology most suited to meet desired needs.

3. To implement these procedures, the cooperation of addressees will be required. Toward this end a meeting is scheduled to discuss planned policies at 1330 hours, 24 Oct 75 in DC-4 (room 911) Pomponio Plaza.

4. (U) Request all activities, down to branch level, who originate requirements within HITS assure representation at this meeting. Accordingly, it is requested that the action officer, _____, US Navy, _____, be provided names, telephone numbers and office symbols of representatives who will attend this meeting no later than 20 Oct 75.

COMMENT. VU TIEN DID NOT COMMENT ON THEIR LOCATIONS.

VU TIEN MADE THE REMARK IN COMMENTING ON RECENT AMERICAN EFFORTS, SUCH AS THE ROSS P E R O T MISSION, TO SEND AID TO AMERICAN POWS IN NORTH VIETNAM. HE SAID THE POWS HAD BEEN CONVICTED BY A WAR CRIMES TRIBUNAL AND CHARGED THAT

THE AMERICANS INTENDED TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF PEROT'S ATTEMPTS TO TAKE AID TO THE PRISONERS AND VIETNAMESE CHILDREN TO

COLLECT INTELLIGENCE ON NORTH VIETNAM, VU TIEN CAUTIONED THAT AMERICAN PLOTS ARE IMPROVIS AND THAT IF THEY DO NOT

ACHIEVE THEIR ENDS BY ONE MEANS THEY WILL TRY BY ANOTHER.

--1981: HE WAS RELEASED FROM CUSTODY AND WAS SELECTED TO BE A MEDICAL PRACTITIONER (BAREFOOT DOCTOR) TO WORK WITH EIGHT LAO AND EIGHT VIETNAMESE MILITARY DOCTORS IN TREATING SICK AND WOUNDED PERSONNEL AT VARIOUS MILITARY CAMPS ((IN AN AREA)) FROM OU TAI DISTRICT, PHONGSALY PROVINCE, TO DAICHOUN DISTRICT, SARAVAN PROVINCE.

SUBJ: THAI HUMINT REPORT CONCERNING US POWS IN LAOS
2. HOW THE SOURCE LEARNED OF THE DETENTION FACILITY FOR AMERICAN POWS.

THE INFORMANT STATED THAT HE OBTAINED THIS INFORMATION FROM HIS OWN OBSERVATIONS ON MANY OCCASONS. THESE PERSONAL OBSERVATIONS CONVINCED HIM THAT ((THE STORY CONCERNING A POW FACILITY)) IS TRUE. ADDITIONAL DETAILS WERE PROVIDED TO THE INFORMANT BY A SECONDARY SOURCE NAMED MR. MUST (SURNAME UNKNOWN), CHIEF OF A 20-MAN LOCAL MILITIA UNIT. THE PERSONNEL IN THIS UNIT ARE ALL LAO ARAA TRIBESMAN AND ARE STATIONED AT BAN KADON (UNLOCATED, NAM HIANG SUBDISTRICT, LAMAM DISTRICT, SARAVAN PROVINCE. THEY WERE MISTREATED BY 30 LAO KHA TRIBESMEN MILITARY PERSONNEL WHO HAD 23 AMERICAN POWS IN THEIR CUSTODY IN THE NAM PHUANG AREA TO THE SOUTHEAST OF BAN KADON (DISTANCE UNKNOWN).

ON THE WAY BACK FROM GIVING TREATMENT TO SICK AND WOUNDED PERSONNEL AT VARIOUS TOWNS AND MILITARY CAMPS, THE INFORMANT AND EIGHT VIETNAMESE PERSONNEL ARRIVED AT DAACHOUN DISTRICT, SARAVAN PROVINCE, WHERE THE VIETNAMESE TROOPS SEPARATED FROM THE INFORMANT AND WENT BACK TO BAN PHON (HOME TOWN OF THE INFORMANT, PHON SUBDISTRICT, LAMAM DISTRICT. THEY THEN WENT ON TO BAN KADON, NAM HIANG SUBDISTRICT, LAMAM DISTRICT. (THE INFORMANT)) SURMISES THAT THESE VIETNAMESE PERSONNEL THEN PROBABLY WENT TO THE DETENTION FACILITY FOR AMERICAN POWS.

THE INFORMANT GOT ALONG VERY WELL WITH THE 20 LAO ARAAS OF THE MILITIA UNIT BECAUSE HE SPEAKS THEIR LANGUAGE FLUENTLY. THESE PERSONNEL PROVIDED HIM WITH DETAILS REGARDING THE DETENTION FACILITY FOR AMERICAN POWS BECAUSE THE ARAAS ARE FORCED TO DELIVER PROVISIONS TO THE KHAS AND THE AMERICAN POWS ONCE A WEEK. THE ARAAS, IN GROUPS OF FOUR, TAKE TURNS MAKING THE DELIVERIES. THEY ASKED THE INFORMANT FOR HIS HELP ((IN GETTING BACK TO THE KHA GROUP)). THE ARAAS ARE WILLING TO COOPERATE FULLY IN EXTRICATING THE POWS FROM THE DETENTION CENTER ((AND THEY WANT TO DESTROY THE KHA TROOPS AT THE SAME TIME.

AFTER THE INFORMANT HAD COLLECTED DETAILED INFORMATION, HE WENT UP TO THE AREA OF PHOU VUA OR PHOU NGUA (SHOWN ON THE MAP ((ATTACHED TO THE REPORT))), WHICH IS A HIGH MOUNTAIN. WITH ADVICE FROM THE ARAAS, HE VISUALLY OBSERVED THE LOCATION FROM A DISTANCE OF 800 METERS, AND THUS HE KNOWS THAT THE

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STORY IS TRUE. HE SAW APPROXIMATELY 30 LAO KHA PERSONNEL GUARDING THE POSITION. FOUR ARAKS DELIVER FOOD TO THIS FACILITY ONCE A WEEK. TWO ARAKS EACH CARRY A BASKET OF ABOUT 20 KILOGRAMS OF RICE. (THAT IS POSSIBLY TRUE, BECAUSE THE ARAKS ARE BIG. THEY HAVE MUCH STAMINA. TWO OTHER ARAKS EACH CARRY A SACK OF RICE, CHICKEN, AND SALT. THE DISTANCE BETWEEN BAN KADON AND THE DETENTION FACILITY IS NOT VERY GREAT (THE EXACT DISTANCE IS NOT KNOWN. THE DISTANCE CAN BE CALCULATED BECAUSE THE ARAK TRIBESMAN WHO DELIVER THE PROVISIONS DEPART BAN KADON AT ABOUT 0800 AND ARRIVE AT THE DETENTION FACILITY AT ABOUT 1200. THEY REST FOR A WHILE AND THEN RETURN TO BAN KADON, ARRIVING AT ABOUT 1800.

3. MOTIVATION FOR PROVIDING THE INFORMATION

THE INFORMANT FLED TO THAILAND ON 18 JULY 1984. HE PROVIDED THE INFORMATION TO THE INTERROGATOR BECAUSE HE WANTS TO HELP BRING OUT THE 23 AMERICAN POWS AND TURN THEM OVER TO THE THAI AND AMERICAN AUTHORITIES. THE INFORMANT ALSO WANTS SOMETHING IN RETURN: I.E., HE WANTS HIS FAMILY TO BE TAKEN CARE OF AND WANTS ((HIS FAMILY)) TO BE PERMITTED TO GO TO A THIRD COUNTRY ((AS REFUGEES. THE INFORMANT IS WILLING TO BE A GUIDE FOR A RAID AND OPERATIONS TEAM TO TAKE THE AMERICAN POWS OUT OF THE DETENTION FACILITY. HE WOULD FORMULATE A PLAN WITH THE ARAK MILITIA FORCES TO ACCOMPLISH THIS TASK. THE INFORMANT HAS GOOD EXPERIENCE IN MAP READING AND KNOWS HOW TO FORMULATE A PLAN FOR A RAID TO RESCUE THE POWS. HE WOULD BE GLAD TO GIVE ADVICE TO PERSONNEL OF ANY GROUP THAT IS SINCERE TOWARDS HIM. 4. INFORMATION: DETAILS REGARDING THE LOCATION OF THE DETENTION FACILITY FOR AMERICAN POWS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

IN EARLY JULY 1984, THERE WAS INFORMATION ON THE SIGHTING OF A DETENTION CENTER IN WHICH 23 AMERICAN POWS WERE BEING HELD (THERE WERE PREVIOUSLY 28 POWS, BUT FIVE HAVE SINCE DIED) IN A DENSELY FORESTED VALLEY AT BAN KADON (COORDINATES UNKNOWN), NAM HIANG SUBDISTRICT, LAMAM DISTRICT, SARAVAN PROVINCE.

4.1 THE DETENTION CENTER IS AT THE FOOT OF A MOUNTAIN IN A RECTANGULAR AREA SURROUNDED BY A MOAT RUNNING FROM THE NAM PHUANG (A NEARBY STREAM) AND BY THREE BARBED WIRE FENCES. THE INNERMOST FENCE IS ADJACENT TO TWO STRUCTURES WHICH ARE USED AS SLEEPING QUARTERS FOR THE POWS. THE SECOND FENCE IS ALSO BARBED WIRE. THE OUTERMOST FENCE IS CONCERTINA BARBED WIRE AND RUNS ALONG THE CENTER OF THE MOAT.

THE FACILITIES CONSIST OF:

1. THE TWO STRUCTURES WHICH ARE USED AS SLEEPING QUARTERS FOR THE POWS (INSIDE THE FENCES)
2. ONE KITCHEN FACILITY (OUTSIDE THE FENCES)
3. THREE BARRACKS FOR THE LAO KHA SECURITY GUARDS (OUTSIDE THE FENCES)

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4.2 SECURITY: THERE ARE 30 LAC KHA SECURITY GUARDS ARMED WITH AK-47 RIFLES.

4.3 COMMUNICATIONS: A RADIO TRANSCEIVER IS USED BOTH DAY AND NIGHT FOR COMMUNICATIONS WITH THE CONTROL STATION IN VIENTIANE DISTRICT. A TRANSCEIVER ANTENNA 500 FEET HIGH WAS OBSERVED IN THE VICINITY OF THE DETENTION CENTER.

4.4 INSPECTOR VISITS: ONCE IN A WHILE, 10 TO 20 VIETNAMESE MILITARY PERSONNEL TRAVEL TO INSPECT CONDITIONS AT THE FACILITY, AND THEN THEY LEAVE.

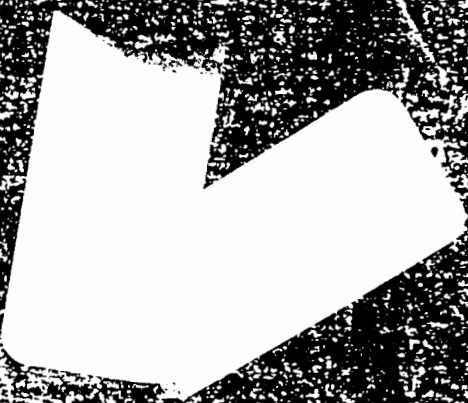

1. I APPRECIATE YOUR EXPRESSION OF CONCERN RE U.S. PILOTS HELD PRISONER IN LAOS. IT IS ONE OF MOST VEXING AND LEAST TRACTABLE PROBLEMS WITH WHICH WE ARE FACED.

2. IN ASSESSING HOW WE MIGHT STIMULATE RELEASE BY PATHET LAO I HAVE NATURALLY BEEN DRAWN TO COMPARE SITUATION WITH THAT WHICH PROMPTED RELEASES BY NORTH VIETNAMESE. AS I SEE THAT SITUATION, THERE WERE AT LEAST THREE FACTORS WHICH YOU USED SUCCESSFULLY TO OBTAIN SOME RELEASES: (A) HANOI'S SENSITIVITY TO ITS FAILURE TO HONOR GENEVA CONVENTION AND PARTICULARLY TO PERMIT RED CROSS PARTICIPATION; (B) HANOI'S REALIZATION THAT IT MISHANDLED EARLY PROPAGANDA ATTEMPTS THROUGH EAST GERMAN NEWSREELS. AND YOUR PROMPT EXPLOITATION OF THAT MISHANDLING THROUGH LIFE MAGAZINE, AND (C) HANOI'S EFFORTS TO INFLUENCE AMERICAN PUBLIC THROUGH APPEAL TO "PEACE GROUPS" - COUPLED WITH YOUR WILLINGNESS TO USE THESE "PEACE GROUPS" AS COURIERS FOR RELEASED PILOTS.

3. UNFORTUNATELY, THERE IS PRACTICALLY NO RPT NO PARALLEL IN PATHET LAO SITUATION WITH ANY OF THESE FACTORS. MOREOVER, SITUATION IS COMPLICATED BY EVIDENCE THAT A NUMBER OF PILOTS MISSING IN LAOS ARE CAPTIVES OF NORTH VIETNAMESE. AT LEAST ONE INSTANCE, SEEM TO HAVE BEEN TAKEN FROM

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HANOI). FURTHERMORE, OTHER POSSIBLE ANGLES (SUCH AS USING NORTH VIETNAMESE PRISONERS HELD HERE IN LAOS) HAVE ALL BEEN FRUITLESSLY EXAMINED.

4. ONLY LEVERAGE WHICH HAS SOME SIMILARITY WITH NORTH VIETNAMESE SITUATION IS POSSIBLE PATHET LAO SENSITIVITY TO RED CROSS APPEALS. ICRC REPRESENTATIVES WHO HAVE DEALT WITH LOCAL PATHET LAO REPRESENTATIVE HAVE ALWAYS BEEN RECEIVED COURTEOUSLY, BUT WITHOUT ANY EVIDENCE THAT PATHET LAO ARE EMBARRASSED BY THEIR REFUSAL TO PERMIT RED CROSS VISITS OR OTHER PARTICIPATION. I WOULD CERTAINLY BE WILLING TO ENCOURAGE MORE ACTIVE ICRC EFFORT HERE, ESPECIALLY IF GENEVA WOULD SEND SOMEONE OF STATURE AND WITH A CERTAIN FORCEFULNESS.

5. ON THE OTHER HAND, I DOUBT THAT "PEACE GROUPS", SUCH AS THOSE DIRECTED BY DELLINGER, WOULD BE HELPFUL. I FEEL THAT WE COULD EXPECT THEM TO LEND THEIR VOICES TO PATHET LAO ACCUSATIONS AGAINST THE U.S. RATHER THAN TO SERIOUS EFFORTS ON BEHALF OF THE PILOTS. HOWEVER, A GENUINE PACIFIST SUCH AS STEWART MEACHEM, THE QUAKER WHO PARTICIPATED IN MOST RECENT PILOT RELEASE FROM HANOI, MIGHT BE USEFUL. IF MEACHEM (OR SOME SIMILAR QUAKER) COULD BE DISENGAGED FROM THOSE GROUPS WITH AN ESSENTIALLY POLITICAL ORIENTATION AND SENT HERE, HE MIGHT AT LEAST BRING CERTAIN HELPFUL PRESSURES TO BEAR.

6. IF ONE SUCH ENVOY COULD COME, I BELIEVE IT SHOULD BE DONE QUIETLY, AND ON BEHALF OF SOME PILOT FAMILIES, RATHER THAN AT BEHEST U.S. GOVERNMENT. ON OTHER HAND, HE SHOULD PROBABLY COME ADEQUATELY EQUIPPED WITH FUNDS (WHICH U.S. GOVT MIGHT ARRANGE FUNNEL TO HIM THROUGH THESE FAMILIES) SO THAT HE CAN OFFER TO CHARTER ICC HELICOPTER FOR TRIP TO KHANG KHAY - OR ANYWHERE ELSE IN LAOS THAT MIGHT PROVE USEFUL.

7. WE HAVE JUST LEARNED THAT ARTHUR HESFORD, BROTHER OF PETER HESFORD (ONE OF DOWNED PILOTS) IS COMING TO LAOS IN NEAR FUTURE. WE WILL TRY OUT VARIOUS APPROACHES WITH HIM, INCLUDING OUR CONTINUING EFFORTS TO SEND PACKAGES AND LETTERS TO OUR PILOTS, AND WILL REPORT RESULTS.

SUBJECT: U.S. POW Project

1. The [REDACTED] reviews many and various sources of information in the exploitation of aerial photography of Southeast Asia. As a by-product of its research effort on this area [REDACTED] began compiling information on captured U.S. military personnel. This effort was responsive to [REDACTED], dated 14 April 1966 which stated that "an aggressive program is underway to determine the locations and assist American prisoners held by the Viet Cong, Pathet Lao, and North Vietnamese." In the ensuing 3½ months approximately 3,000 pieces of information have been screened for pertinence to this program. The materials exploited include intelligence reports, cables, ground photography, aerial photography, maps and charts, domestic and foreign newspapers, books, pamphlets, magazines, etc.

2. The [REDACTED] collection was organized to tie in all information possible to an individual prisoner, hence the creation of the U.S. POW Profile Card. During this period [REDACTED] Analysts sought out other organizations within the Intelligence Community that were making efforts to collect this type of information. The following organizations were contacted:
