Dear Ms. Dyer:

In accordance with the decision which Judge Paul Friedman issued on July 22, 2002 in the above-referenced case, I enclose a check in the amount of \$1,000 to pay for the further search of records specified in Judge Friedman's August 16, 2000. Opinion.

My client, Roger Hall, directs that the searches should be carried out in the following order of priority:

1. Searches using the terms "PW" and "Pws."
2. Expanded searches made pursuant to Executive Order 12,812 to account for the period from November 11, 1993 to January 13, 1994, for Mr. Hall's January 5, 1994 request, and for the period from November 11, 1993 to May 29, 1998, for the his fourth request dated April 23, 1998. See August 16, 2002 Opinion at p. 10.
3. Searches for all photographs, including all ground photography and all overhead photographs and satellite imagery.

Please keep detailed records of all charges incurred during the course of this search and provide them to me.

As you may be aware, Section 1082 of the National Defense Authorization Act for 1991 and 1992, also known as the McCain Bill, provides that the primary next-of-kin (PNOK) may authorize the disclosure of information pertaining to POW/MIAs to whom they are related. By letter dated November 1, 2000, the Defense Prisoner of War/Missing Personnel Office provided Mr. Hall with a list of PNOK authorizations as of October 4, 2000. A copy of that list is enclosed.


Mr. Hall has garnered an additional 46 PNOK authorizations, which are also enclosed herewith.
