**UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR EXENTION OF TIME
TO FILE RESPONSE TO CIA'S SUPPLEMENTAL MEMORANDUM**

Come now the plaintiffs, Roger Hall and Studies Solutions Results, Inc., (hereafter collectively referred to as "Hall"), and move this Court for an extension of time, to and including December 14, 2010, to respond to the CIA's Supplemental Memorandum in Response to this Court's Memorandum Opinion and Order of November 12, 2009. As grounds for this motion, Hall represents to the Court as follows:


- 1. Hall's response is presently due on or before October 28, 2010.**
- 2. On October 25, 2010, Hall's counsel completed a brief in Morley vC.I.A., Civil Action No. 03-2545. In Lardner v. F.B.I., Civil Action No. 03-0874, Hall's counsel has moved for an extension, to and including November 8, 2010, within which to file a brief which was due on October 25, 2010, but which counsel will not be able to begin work on until October 27th or 28th. Immediately following the filing of the Lardner brief, counsel will have to commence work on the Brief for Appellant in Blackwell v. F.B.I., D.C. Cir. No. 10-5072, which is due on November 22, 2010, the**

day counsel leaves for vacation in California with his wife and several members of his family and his wife's family. He will not return to work in Washington, D.C. until November 30, 2010.

3. Additionally, problems have arisen regarding the voluminous release of records by the CIA at the time of its supplemental filing. The CIA provided a copy of Cole Deposition Exhibit C, which comprises perhaps 2,000 pages of records or so, but did not provide a copy to co-plaintiff Accuracy in Media, which is a different party represented by different counsel. The undersigned counsel intended to have the Cole Deposition Exhibit C scanned onto CD-ROMs so it could be made available to his client and to Accuracy in Media as well as to himself. He had planned to use a recently-hired parttime intern to do this work. However, not to long after this project began the of the office at which the intern was interning left for other employment, leaving the intern in charge. Initially, the intern was only employed part-time in her new capacity, but this soon changed and she now runs the office as a full-time employee and is only able to work on the scanning project Saturday afternoons. She will be finishing the scanning project within the next two weeks, but this problem illustrates some of the unforeseen difficulties that have arisen during this case.

4. Defendant does not oppose this motion. Plaintiff Accuracy in Media joins In this motion.
