This document is a 1-page CIA memorandum to the Director of the Defense Intelligence Agency, Lt. General Donald v. Bennett, concerning the possible sightings in South Laos of four captured American pilots in Mid-1970 and two captured American pilots in early 1969. Internal CIA organizational notations such as dissemination control markings and CIA numbers have been withheld. The substantive portion of this document has been released. This document is UNCLASSIFIED, but the redacted information remains statutorily exempted from release under the FOIA.

This document is withheld in part on the basis of FOIA exemption (b)(3).

Exemption (b)(3): This document is withheld in part on the basis of FOIA exemption (b)(3). This document contains internal organizational data and functions by the CIA that is specifically exempted from disclosure pursuant to the Central Intelligence Agency Act of 1949, and thus is protected from disclosure by exemption (b)(3).
