Scope & Content: These files document the efforts made in the retrieval of Prisoners of War (POW) and in resolution of the status of those Missing in Action (MIA). This includes POW/MIAs from military actions that occurred prior to the war in Vietnam (the Korean War for example). These files deal with military and civilian personnel, private citizens, and others who were held or believed to be held by the government of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam, the National Liberation Front (in the Republic of Vietnam), the Pathet Lao and the Khmer Rouge. Some mention is made in these records of POW/MIA concerns that arose out of the Arab-Israeli wars of the period. In addition to the return of the POWs these records relate to the debriefings of returnees and people who had knowledge of the existence or knew the whereabouts of POW/MIAs. These records also document efforts made by the Department of State, the Armed Forces and private citizens to secure the release of those held in South East Asia. Because of the broad based involvement in this issue, documents within these files consist of those generated by multiple civilian agencies of the Federal Government, the four branches of the Armed Forces, the Office of the Secretary of Defense, State governments, and correspondence from various private institutions as well as individual citizens. In addition to documents these records contain press and newspaper clippings, audio tapes, and magazines.

Agency History: Department of Human Rights and Humanitarian Affairs has principal responsibility in the Department of State for policy counsel at decision-making levels on matters relating to human rights and humanitarian affairs in the conduct of U.S. foreign policy. By statute (Pub. L. 95-105, August 17, 1977, 91 Stat. 846), its responsibilities also embrace matters relating to refugees (including the Department's review of asylum requests), prisoners of war, and members of the U.S. Armed Forces missing in action. The responsibility of the United States to

speaking out on behalf of international human rights and standards was formalized in the early 1970's. In 1976 Congress enacted legislation creating a Coordinator of Human Rights in the U.S. Department of State, a position later upgraded to Assistant Secretary. In 1994 the Bureau of Human Rights and Humanitarian Affairs was reorganized and renamed as the Bureau of Democracy, Human Rights, and Labor, reflecting both a broader sweep and a more focused approach to the interlocking issues of human rights, workers rights, and democracy.

bureaus of the Department responsible for substantive operations. The incumbent also participated in the Secretary's Staff Meeting and maintained a close relationship with the Department's member on the NSC Planning Board. The Operations Coordinator briefed and debriefed the Department's OCB member, attended weekly OCB meetings, and represented the Department at the weekly meeting of the Board Assistants, and oversaw the activities of the Department of State member of almost 50 interdepartmental working groups. M/OP was terminated along with the OCB in February 1961.

The files contain memorandums, extracts, notes and excerpts, briefing material, drafts, guidances, reports, chits, notes, correspondence, telegrams, documents, minutes of meetings, clippings, intelligence estimates, and other material. Specific topics include agricultural surpluses, Antarctica, aviation, broadcasting, Buddhism, chemical warfare, Communist conspiracy, cultural affairs, civil defense, disarmament, escapees and defectors, economic policy, intelligence matters, labor, law of the sea, NATO, the NSC, nuclear energy, the Olympics, Open Skies, prisoners of war, and psychological warfare. The office considered these records to be "Administrative Files" but the title "Subject Files" is much more appropriate.

These records are of sufficient archival and historical value to warrant transfer to the National archives. They contain unique and important documentation on the Department of State's participation in the formulation of basic national security policies during the Eisenhower Administration and the participation of the Department of State in the OCB. These documents also include important marginalia that will be found nowhere else. I recommend approval of this item. The files in boxes 2482 and 2483 are part of the main series that were somehow separated before boxing. I recommend that they be interfiled during archival processing.

{2} Country and Regional Files, 1953-1961. 8 feet. Arranged alphabetically by name of country or region. There are sometimes subject files under a specific country (i.e. Korea-MiG Pilot Defection). The files include memorandums chits notes, extracts, notes of meetings, drafts, telegrams, reports, documents, clippings, intelligence estimates, correspondence, and operations plans. This is a request for guidance on the handling of materials that we have received or have been offered relating to POW/MIA matters. There are two groups of materials with which we are concerned.

Late in 1993, we received a SF 258 for State Department materials that were subsequently delivered to NNTA-S. What NNTA-S received was 40 cubic feet of electrostatic copies that appear to have been thrown into boxes with little attention to arrangement. No listing of any kind accompanied the copies. Now, Dick Wood has received a call from a Mr. Sprague of the Department of Defense, who says he has another 10 linear feet of copies that were referred to him by the State Department for declassification review. Mr. Sprague also says that State requested that, when the review was complete, the copies be sent to NSC (apparently because the copies were made for the Kerry Committee). However, when he contacted NSC, he was told to contact NNTA-S.

The other materials consist of copies of reports prepared by the POW/MIA Commission of which Acting N is a member. We have received a SF 258 and copies of commission reports from the Department of the Army from the period when Army provided administrative support to the commission. We have also received one four-page report (copy) with a SF 258 and several additional copies of reports from the Office of the Secretary of Defense, which took over administrative duties from Army. We have not received a SF 258 for the last group of copies.

Records officers at the Office of the Secretary of Defense have expressed concern regarding the transfer of these materials as records inasmuch as the originals are scheduled for transfer after 25 years. The same would be true of the State Department copies, after 30 years.

Are we to continue to accept these transfers as records or should the copies be treated as reference copies only? If the latter, should we cancel the SF 258 for the set we have already received from Army? Can we or should we accept the material Mr. Sprague has without a separate SF 258?

5. 29 July 1953. A U.S. Air Force RB-50 was shot down over the Sea of Japan. One man lived. American search planes saw groups of Soviet patrol boats in the vicinity of the wreckage. 13 men are unaccounted for. 13
6. 17 April 1955. A U.S. Air Force RB-47 was shot down east of Kamchatka. The Russians tracked the U.S. search effort and sent their own patrols into the wreckage area. 3 men are unaccounted for. 3
7. 10 September 1956. A U.S. Air Force RB-50 was lost on patrol over the Sea of Japan. The flight plan's proximity to the U.S.S.R. made the U.S. State Department suspect a shootdown. 16 men are unaccounted for. 16
8. 2 September 1958. A U.S. Air Force a C-130 was shot down over Armenia. The Russians have provided detailed information on the shootdown and crash. 13 men are unaccounted for. 13
9. 1 July 1960. A U.S. Air Force RB-47 was shot down over the Barents Sea. The Russians have given us documents that indicate that they recovered Major Eugene Posa's body, but they don't know where it is now. 3 men are unaccounted for. 3
10. 14 December 1965. A U.S. Air Force RB-57 was lost on patrol over the Black Sea. Due to the plane's proximity to the U.S.S.R., the American side suspected a shootdown. 2 men are still unaccounted for. 2

1. 8 April 1950. A U.S. Navy PB4Y2 was shot down over the Baltic. 10 men are unaccounted for. 10
2. 6 November 1951. A U.S. Navy P2V was shot down southeast of Vladivostok. 10 men are unaccounted for. 10
3. 13 June 1952. A U.S. Air Force RB-29 was shot down over the Sea of Japan. American search planes found empty life rafts, but no survivors. 12 men are unaccounted for. 12
4. 7 October 1952. A U.S. Air Force RB-29 was shot down north of Hokkaido. The Russians have given us documents that indicate that they recovered Captain John R. Dunham, but since then can not find his remains. 8 men are unaccounted for. 8
5. 29 July 1953. A U.S. Air Force RB-50 was shot down over the Sea of Japan. One man lived. American search planes saw groups of Soviet patrol boats in the vicinity of the wreckage. 13 men are unaccounted for. 13

6. 17 April 1955. A U.S. Air Force RB-47 was shot down east of Kamchatka. The Russians tracked the U.S. search effort and sent their own patrols into the wreckage area. 3 men are unaccounted for. 3
7. 10 September 1956. A U.S. Air Force RB-50 was lost on patrol over the Sea of Japan. The flight plan's proximity to the U.S.S.R. made the U.S. State Department suspect a shootdown. 16 men are unaccounted for. 16
8. 2 September 1958. A U.S. Air Force a C-130 was shot down over Armenia. The Russians have provided detailed information on the shootdown and crash. 13 men are unaccounted for. 13

9. 1 July 1960. A U.S. Air Force RB-47 was shot down over the Barents Sea. The Russians have given us documents that indicate that they recovered Major Eugene Posa's body, but they don't know where it is now. 3 men are unaccounted for. 3
10. 14 December 1965. A U.S. Air Force RB-57 was lost on patrol over the Black Sea. Due to the plane's proximity to the U.S.S.R., the American side suspected a shootdown. 2 men are still unaccounted for. 2

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
