These files deal with military and civilian personnel, private citizens, and others who were held or believed to be held by the government of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam, the National Liberation Front (in the Republic of Vietnam), the Pathet Lao and the Khmer Rouge. Some mention is made in these records of POW/MIA concerns that arose out of the Arab-Israeli wars of the period. In addition to the return of the POWs these records relate to the debriefings of returnees and people who had knowledge of the existence or knew the whereabouts of POW/MIAs. These records also document efforts made by the Department of State, the Armed Forces and private citizens to secure the release of those held in South East Asia. Because of the broad based involvement in this issue, documents within these files consist of those generated by multiple civilian agencies of the Federal Government, the four branches of the Armed Forces, the Office of the Secretary of Defense, State governments, and correspondence from various private institutions as well as individual citizens. In addition to documents these records contain press and newspaper clippings, audio tapes, and magazines.

Agency History: Department of Human Rights and Humanitarian Affairs has principal responsibility in the Department of State for policy counsel at decision-making levels on matters relating to human rights and humanitarian affairs in the conduct of U.S. foreign policy. By statute (Pub. L. 95-105, August 17, 1977, 91 Stat. 846), its responsibilities also embrace matters relating to refugees (including the Department's review of asylum requests), prisoners of war, and members of the U.S. Armed Forces missing in action. The responsibility of the United States to



Scope & Content: This series consists of one Department of State lot file from the United States Mission in Geneva, Switzerland. The file (71F6) consists of one folder of telegrams, and letters (from January 1966) relating to a possible exchange of prisoners of war between the United States, North Vietnam and South Vietnam.

History: Early in the Revolutionary War the Continental Congress began to send diplomatic agents on missions to various European courts. With the appointment of Benjamin Franklin on September 14, 1778, as Minister Plenipotentiary to France, the United States had its first resident or permanent diplomatic representative. The early diplomats frequently served also in a consular capacity until a 1792 act of Congress set up an independent consular service. The foundations for the present Foreign Service were laid by an act of March 1, 1855 (10 Stat. 619), which defined the duties and fixed the pay for the

diplomatic and consular services. From time to time the two services were reorganized by legislation and by Executive order and, by the Rogers Act of May 24, 1924 (43 Stat. 140), they were combined into a single Foreign Service. American diplomatic and consular posts have been established or discontinued as the interests of the Nation have dictated. As of 1990 there were 144 American embassies, 9 missions, 71 consulates general, 26 consulates, 1 branch office, and 23 consular agencies throughout the world.
